For **General & Banking Awareness**, focus primarily on **the last 4–6 months of current affairs**, with greater emphasis on topics that have a direct connection with the banking, financial, economic, and government policy landscape.

- **Current Affairs:** Cover important national and international events from the past 4–6 months. Focus on major developments, reports, indices, appointments, awards, and important events.
- **Banking & Financial Awareness:** Give special attention to **RBI guidelines, monetary policy, repo rate, banking regulations, financial terms, digital banking, and major developments in the financial sector.**
- **Static GK:** Prepare relevant static topics such as **national parks, international organisations, currencies, important institutions, stadiums, headquarters, and related facts.**
- **Government Schemes & Economic Updates:** Focus on **new and revised government schemes, key government initiatives, Budget-related developments, economic policies, and important economic updates.**

Key Strategy:

- For Mains, don't just memorise facts.
- Try to understand the **background, objective, significance, and recent developments** related to important current affairs, especially in the banking and economic sectors.

Best Practices:

- Don't make bulky notes 
- Revise weekly, not daily 
- Understand the **"why" behind events**
